When Concerned About Development Infant and Early Mental Health Promotion





- Making a Referral is a Start
 - It is essential, but not enough
- Wait times can be excessive
- In each community a lead is needed to create a "gap" plan
- We call this a Developmental Support Plan

What is a Developmental Support Plan?





- It is a common document for a child and those caring for that child
- Provides a goal for each domain and identifies a child's strengths
- Provides caregivers with simple strategies they use during everyday routines to support a child's achievement of the goals

The Rationale for DSPs





1. Brain development

- Synaptic production
- Impact of experience
- Impact of toxic stress

2. Early intervention

3. Something is better than doing nothing

- Referring to a waitlist is always the first step...but when there is a wait time...
- 4. Ethics of not doing anything (given the science) is difficult to live with

What is the Purpose of DSPs?





- Support a child's development
- Make the most of the time a child is waiting for more intensive services or assessments
- Provides all those who are caring for a child with a shared vision of what that child needs
- Provides parents/caregivers with concrete strategies to support a child's development
- Shows caregivers how their relationship with the child can support their child's development
- Provides a holistic view of the child
- Ensure ongoing screening for children who may be at risk

What is a DSP NOT...





- A substitute for more intensive assessment or interventions
- A quick fix
- Diagnostic
- Prescriptive
